Rules and regulations

- 1) The Education Officer is your first point of contact for any information, queries or complaints regarding the Zoo Club.
- 2) All youth club members must wear uniform (Cap and T-Shirt) with full length dull coloured trousers, shoes and Zoo Club ID card at all times.
- 3) Throughout the Zoo Club duration, members will always be accompanied by authorised staff
- 4) Zoo club members must not enter any animal enclosures or restricted areas.
- 5) Any member who does not attend sessions for two consecutive weeks will be removed from the Zoo Club Programme.
- 6) Members who are unable to attend a session, will need to inform the Education Officer at least a day before the planned session.
- 7) Zoo club members will not be allowed to leave the premises of BBP on their own. They must be accompanied by their parent(s)/ guardian unless prior written permission is given to the Education Officer.
- 8) During the sessions, zoo club members must not attempt to feed, touch, tease any animals at BBP.
- 9) Possession or usage of tobacco, alcohol or any other illegal substances will result in strict action against the Zoo Club member and elimination from the programme.
- 10) BBP has the right to eliminate any zoo club member if they do not abide by the rules and regulation of BBP.

Programme details:

This programme aims to **inspire young minds to connect with nature, wildlife and work towards conservation of the same by bringing about relevant changes in their day to day activities.**

- **Every Sunday for 15 weeks:** Includes **workshops, field visits and group activities** to understand the need for conserving wildlife, nature and alter their lifestyle to co-exist with the same.
- Programme schedule: **10 am to 1 pm;**
- Intake: **50 – 60 students, on a first come first serve basis.**
- Age limit: 12 to 18 years
- Registration Fee: **₹. 1000/- (Concession for government school children)**
- Items to be submitted for registration: **3 passport size photos; copy of aadhaar, school ID card; blood group certificate (if blood group is not mentioned in any ID) and registration fee.**
- Items to be provided to the students: **Uniform (T-Shirt and Cap) and ID card.**
- **On successful completion of the Youth Club Programme,** students will receive a completion certificate and outstanding students will be honoured.

- This programme involves indoor and outdoor activities from 10 am to 1 pm. Parents/ guardians are requested to ensure their children have breakfast before attending the programme and can carry snacks and water.
- Lunch is not provided and it is the parent's / guardian's responsibility to pick up their children at 1 pm.
